Butterflies & Squirrels 0-2 Years

In the baby and toddler rooms we aim to establish a good relationship with the children and to be able to continue your daily routine and wishes as much as possible. All the babies and toddlers receive individual care as well as group activity time, which will include arts and crafts, singing and music time, along with outdoor play. The baby room and toddler rooms are equipped with all the necessary items that you might expect to see, as well as bright colours, warmth and especially, trained and caring staff.

We also believe it is important for you as parents to feel comfortable within nursery and to know the staff that are looking after your little ones. We believe in supporting the families and carers of our children and some of the things we offer to help the transition include:

- 3 free trial sessions to help your child's transition into nursery.
- For the small babies we ask you to make many contacts with nursery prior to leaving baby so everyone is familiar to all the new faces and sights.
- All babies receive their own day to day diary to record their daily routine
- To be provided with an information booklet and given the opportunity to ask any questions that you may have
- As a Breastfeeding friendly nursery, we are always happy to help and support parents with feeding and weaning their child.
- Medicine can be administered with prior permission and will be included in the diary so you know that it has been given and at what time



Foxes & Badgers 2-3 Years

The second and third years of a child's life include continued rapid growth and development in the cognitive, motor, social and emotional, and language domains. By understanding the norms of your child's development during this time and ways to assess your child's progress will ensure by working together your child is off to a great start in life.

We offer lots of activities to stimulate and challenge the children. They have a structured routine, which allows lots of time for free play, dressing up and make believe play, jigsaws, threading, and counting. Art and Craft activities are a big part of the day, and also includes baking, sand and water play.

During the daily routine there are also quiet times when the children are encouraged to listen quietly to stories, play musical instruments and join in with singing. We use the garden in all types of weather and provide a selection of wellington boots, umbrellas and hats. The outdoor area has lots of equipment including a musical area, planting, water and sand.

By the time your child reaches the age of 3 years they are usually well grounded by knowing their colours, shapes, recognising their name, and also able to hold a pencil. They usually have good social manners and are able to hold small but interesting conversations with grown ups as well as children of their own age.



Hedgehogs 3-5 Years

By now your child should be ready for more complicated tasks and is more adventurous. Their concentration level is greater, so we recognise this by increasing the daily routine with more challenging activities.

Our Pre-school offers the highest standard of pre-school care and education, where children are provided with a safe, supportive, stimulating and fun environment so that they are able to explore and discover the world and fulfil their potential.

There is a clearly defined learning outcome to our pre-school activities whereby there is a balance of free-flow and adult-led activities. The role of the staff is to support and extend the learning further, developing the children's spontaneous play and offering planned play-based activities. By observing them regularly and listening to information given by parents, the staff are able to plan activities using the children's own interests and individual needs.

Children are encouraged to develop their independence to help prepare them for school. We work with the children's next schools to help make the transition from nursery to the Reception year as smooth as possible, this includes inviting the teachers to nursery to meet the children in the summer term and discussing their stage of learning and development. Your child has opportunity to develop on number work, alphabet, reading and writing skills, ready for starting primary school.

Our pre-school has a wide range of equipment to support children's play and we choose toys which encourage children to develop their creativity. We ensure children are prepared for life in the modern world and our equipment includes a computer for children's use with educational games plus ICT toys and equipment.



Our Approach

Learning through play

At Honeybuns Nurseries our main aim is to provide a stimulating, Caring and secure environment for your child in which they will blossom.

We observe our key children, following the structure and curriculum of the EYF5 to gain an understanding of how they develop and the style in which they learn. From these observations we are able to tailor our provision and the activities we offer for each individual child's stage and needs. Through this we strive for every child to achieve their full potential and beyond, gaining the most from the time they spend with us.

We cover the seven areas of learning and development of the early year's foundation stage which are:

- Personal, social and emotional development
- Communication, Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding of the world
- Expressive Arts and Design

We value parents input in their child's learning and share interests that the children have with us, understanding the importance of home and setting links. We hold parents evenings throughout the year to share each child's learning and discuss possible next steps by working together.

We have a range of resources and activities available to the children all day every day throughout the different rooms for them to explore.

Sensory/Tactile play includes – Sand, water, clay, play dough, salt, corn flour gloop, pasta, lintels, flour, sugar, cereal, beans, mud, shaving foam and exploring objects from the natural environment.

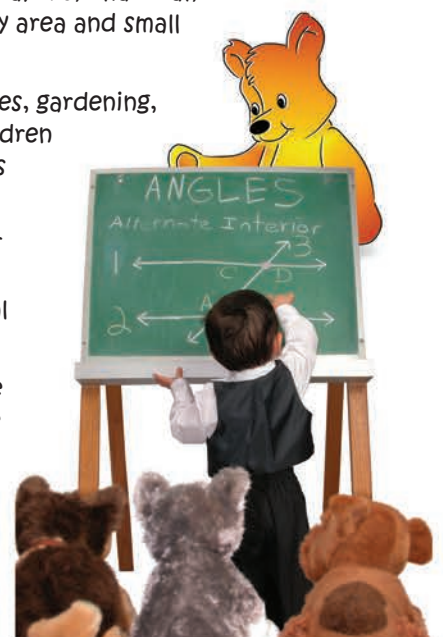
Expressive Arts and Design includes – dancing, cooking, painting and drawing using a range of mark making resources such as pens, pencils, crayons, Charcoal, pastels, sponges, ink stamps, sticks with paint, printing, role-play area and small world toys.

Physical Development activities – Balancing Beams, balance bikes, gardening, climbing, obstacle courses, walks in the local environment. Children are encouraged to become aware of their bodies physical needs and the need for a healthy life style.

Understanding of the World – Computer games to develop ICT skills, remote control bugs, sound boxes that record voices, magnetic games, feelings circle times, and collections of natural resources to explore.

Mathematics – Resources and activities are provided to ensure that the children are given opportunity to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems, and to describe shapes, spaces and measures.

Outings in the local environment – walks to the library to change and choose books, walks to the park, walks to the shops to buy snacks, walks to feed the ducks and explore the local environment.



Our Staff



The commitment and experience found within our staff team at Honeybuns is a large part of what makes us exceptional in the quality of care we provide. Our team is passionate about building individual relationships with our children, and understands that each child is unique.

At Honeybuns, we invest in our team and recognise their commitment to our nursery and your children. We work closely with outside training providers to support their professional development in every area of their work.



Our management team lead by example, and motivate our staff by demonstrating a strong work ethic, which in turn provides an exceptional working environment, and allows them to provide outstanding care, learning through play and development opportunities for your child.

Under 'The Safeguarding Vulnerable Children Act 2006' suitability is checked through obtaining an enhanced criminal records disclosure in respect of every person working directly with the children. Effective systems are in place to ensure that children are kept safe at all times. Staff must disclose any convictions, cautions, court orders, reprimands and warnings that may affect their suitability to work with children (whether received before or during their employment at the setting).



Mealtimes

Our highly experienced resident cooks cater for all dietary requirements. Our meals and snacks are carefully planned, well balanced and prepared on the premises using fresh produce from local suppliers. All children are offered at least 5 portions of fresh fruit and vegetables a day.



Meal times an opportunity to encourage your child to eat a wide range of foods in a relaxed atmosphere with their regular carers. Our menus are always on display, regularly reviewed and we encourage children and parents to make suggestions for all. We often have celebration food linked to various festivals to try and your child will learn many social skills at the dinner table.

Eating healthy food will give your child more energy to do the things they love for longer; it will also help with their concentration. We involve our cook in some of our food activities and try to educate your child as to where the food they eat actually comes from. Your child may grow their own seasonal fruit and vegetables in the nursery garden, which will make mealtimes so much more interesting!

Keeping Your Child Safe security and health & safety

Security is paramount at all times in order to ensure the highest standards of health and safety are maintained. This is exemplified in the following ways:-

Individual care and attention made possible by a high ratio of adults to children ensures close supervision at all times.

All staff are trained in First Aid and on hand if necessary.

All equipment and learning aids conform to British Safety standards.

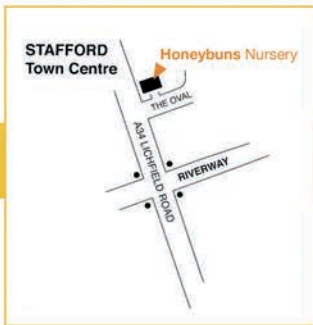
The building is secure and alarmed at all times. The physical environment is maintained along with attention to cleanliness and hygiene.

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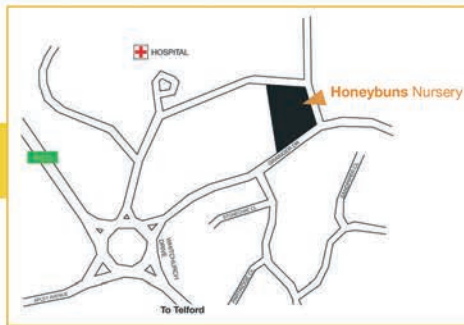


Honeybuns at Stafford

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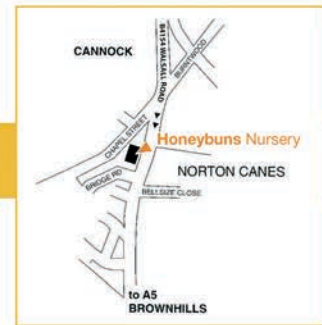
Honeybuns at Telford
