General Information

Please can you ensure your child has a bag (**labelled**) and a spare change of clothes to bring to nursery every day. We only have a small amount of spare clothes and we are running low very quickly. All children must bring a bag with spare clothes in daily. Can we also ask that you check that you are picking up the correct belongings for your child. Follow us on....



Safety

Please can we stress to you that you **must not** carry your child up and down the stairs at nursery. It is really important that you

adhere to this safety notice.

Tax Free Childcare

This is available to around 2 million households to help with the cost of childcare. You'll be able to open an online account, that you can pay into to cover the cost of childcare with Honeybuns. You'll be able to apply for all your children at the same time, when your youngest child becomes eligible.

For every 80p you or someone else pays in, the government will top up an extra 20p.

This is equivalent of the tax most people pay - 20% - which gives the scheme its name, 'tax-free'. The government will top up the account with 20% of childcare costs up to a total of £10,000 - the equivalent of up to £2,000 support per child per year (or £4,000 for disabled children).
